☞ **FACTS ABOUT FURMAN...**Founded in 1826 and located in Greenville, S.C., Furman University, a private independent liberal arts institution, is ranked as one of the 50 finest liberal arts colleges in the country by *U.S. News & World Report*. Furman's 2,600 students, who represent 46 states and 39 countries, enjoy a collegiate experience on a 750-acre campus that was recently listed by the American Society of Landscape Architects as one of America's 362 most beautifully landscaped places. Furman graduates have excelled in many fields, and among a few of the notables are John Broadus Watson, the "father of behavioral psychology"; **Charles Hard Townes**, Nobel-Prize winning inventor of the laser and maser; **Richard W. Riley**, former United States Department of Education Secretary; **Keith Lockhart**, the conductor of the Boston Pops; **Betsy King** and **Beth Daniel**, LPGA Hall-of-Fame members; and **Mark Sanford**, South Carolina's governor-elect. A member of the Southern Conference since 1936, Furman boasts a 17-sport intercollegiate athletic program that ranks among the finest in the country. Within the past year the university's football, men's soccer, women's soccer, men's tennis, women's tennis, and women's golf teams have participated in NCAA Tournament play, and during the 2001-02 school year 29 Furman student-athletes earned All-America honors. On Feb. 13, 1954, Furman's Frank Sely scored an NCAA record 100 points in a 145-95 win over Newberry.

☞ **FIRST OUT OF THE GATE...**Furman will be the first Southern Conference team to open regular season play this year when it squares off against Alabama State this Sunday in the Guardians Classic (see tournament bracket...Page 4). The 2002-03 season will mark the 90th season of basketball for Furman, which played its first basketball game on Oct. 30, 1908, in Columbia against South Carolina (21-19 win in first collegiate basketball game ever played in the state). Furman has played exactly 2000 games in its 90-season hoops history, and the Paladins have notched 996 wins during that time.

☞ **FURMAN OVERVIEW...**Furman returns three starters and nine lettermen off last year's team that went 17-14 and finished as Southern Conference Tournament runner-up. The Paladins dropped a 62-57 decision to Davidson in the tournament title game but still managed to snap a streak of nine consecutive losing campaigns dating back to the 1992-93 season. Furman's tournament championship game appearance was the program's ninth overall but first since 1980, and the Paladins' advance from the preliminary round to championship contest was the first ever by a league team. Furman's three returning starters include 6-3 senior point guard **Guilherme Da Luz** (Sao Paulo, Brazil/11.7 ppg, 5.2 rpg, 206 assists in '01-02), 6-6 senior forward **Kenny Zeigler** (Lithonia, Ga./6.6 ppg, 5.6 rpg in '01-02), and 6-6 sophomore center **Paco Gonzalez** (Miami, Fla./5.5 ppg, 4.4 rpg). Senior guard/forward **Karim Souchu** (Paris, France/14.8 ppg, 5.3 rpg) returns after serving as Furman's "sixth man" last year, and the Paladins' also welcome back 6-8 junior forward **Maleye Ndoye** (Dakar, Senegal/6.1 ppg, 4.0 rpg) and 6-7 sophomore forward **Nick Sanders** (Leavenworth, Kansas/2.4 ppg, 3.4 rpg), who started in 13 games a year ago. Furman's losses to graduation included a pair of guards in **Paul Foster** and **Anthony Thomas**, who combined to shoot 46.8 percent from 3-point range

(110x235) last year, with Thomas finishing second in the Southern Conference (and 18th nationally) in 3-point shooting (45.1%, 88x195). Furman is coached by **Larry Davis** (Asbury '78), who is entering his sixth year at the helm of the Paladin program.

✎ **SCOUTING ALABAMA STATE**...Alabama State, located in Montgomery, Ala., and a member of the Southwestern Athletic Conference, returns three starters and eight lettermen off a squad that went 19-13 overall and finished third in league play a year ago with a 12-6 mark. 6-9 senior center **Alvin Pettway**, who averaged 14.3 ppg and 6.2 rpg in 2001-02, is the Hornets' top returning player. Alabama State also returns 6-4 forward senior forward **Keith Gamble** (10.1 ppg/3.7 rpg in '01-02) and 5-10 junior point guard **Malcolm Campbell** (8.9 ppg, 105 assists in '01-02). The Hornets are coached by **Rob Spivery** (Ashland '72), who is entering his seventh season at the Alabama State (84-91) and 18th campaign overall (259-236).

✎ **FIRST REGULAR SEASON TOURNAMENT APPEARANCE SINCE 1999**...Furman's appearance in the Guardians Classic will be its first regular season tournament participation since the 1999-00 season when the Paladins took part in the SoCon Holiday Hoops Tournament. In that tournament, Furman lost to Mississippi in the first round (75-61) before bouncing back to defeat South Carolina State (77-58) and Old Dominion (68-55) for the consolation championship.

✎ **PALADINS PICKED TO WIN SOCON SOUTH**...On the strength of nine returning lettermen and its strong showing in last season's Southern Conference Tournament, where Furman defeated Western Carolina (65-61) and league regular season south division tri-champions Georgia Southern (73-70), and College of Charleston (44-43), the Paladins were recently picked by conference head coaches as the preseason favorite (along with Georgia Southern) in this year's SoCon South Division race.

✎ **DA LUZ HEADLINES SENIOR CLASS**...Furman's senior class features four veteran performers and the unquestioned leader is point guard **Guilherme Da Luz** (Sao Paulo, Brazil), a three-year starter who last year earned consensus All-Southern Conference honors in voting by league head coaches and media. In earning laurels as one of the conference's top players, Da Luz averaged a solid 11.7 points and 5.2 rebounds per game, and led the league and established new Furman single season (206) and career (519) assist records. As a freshman he broke the school single game assist record with 14 dishes in 97-75 win over Coastal Carolina. In addition to his fine work as a playmaker a year ago, he also paced Furman's perimeter defense with a school season record 64 steals, thus putting him only 41 shy of the school career standard of 194 currently held by **Hal Henderson** (1989-92). Da Luz, who has started in 88 of 89 games in his first three seasons at Furman, heads into the 2001-02 campaign with 934 points, making him a solid candidate to become only the 35th player in school history to top the 1,000-point plateau. In Furman's lone preseason exhibition contest, he came very close to recording a triple double, tallying 22 points, nine rebounds, and nine assists in the Paladins' 97-59 win over the Southeast Atlanta All Stars on Nov. 7.

Cougar head coach John Kresse said, "Da Luz is some kind of point guard. He's the John Stockton and Mark Jackson point guard of the Southern Conference."

✎ **NEW POSITION, STARTING ROLE AWAIT SOUCHU**...Not many teams have their leading scorer come off the bench, but that was the case last year with Furman and **Karim Souchu** (Paris, France), who averaged 14.8 ppg while serving as the Paladins' "sixth man" for much of the 2001-02 campaign. This year Souchu appears set to rejoin the Paladin starting lineup but at a new position, wing guard, where he will take over for the graduated **Anthony Thomas**, who finished second in the Southern Conference and 17th nationally in 3-point shooting (45.1%, 88x195) last year. At 6-foot-7, Souchu has registered action at small forward and power forward while leading Furman in scoring in his first three seasons, so the switch to wing guard represents a new move. Over the summer he played with the French National Team and averaged 14.1 ppg in helping his squad to a 6-1 record that included a pair of wins over Israel, Algeria, and New Zealand (a semifinalist in the 2002 World Championships in Indianapolis). A two-time All-Southern Conference selection, he heads into the season ranked 17th on Furman's career scoring charts with 1,410 points, having tallied double figures in 76 games. He also ranks fifth on the school's all-time steals list with 147 thefts, just behind teammate **Guilherme Da Luz** (153 steals).

✎ **ZEIGLER LOOKING FOR FAST START**...Senior forward **Kenny Zeigler** (Lithonia, Ga.) is looking for a solid start to the 2002-03 season — at least when compared to the start he endured a year ago. Slowed with a sprained ankle that ultimately forced him to miss four games, Zeigler only averaged 2.2 ppg and 3.1 rpg over the Paladins' first 11 contests. Beginning with a 12-point, 10-rebound outing against Davidson on Jan. 12, however, he turned his season around and played a significant role in Furman's strong stretch run on the way to the 17-14 campaign. Over the Paladins' final 17 games, Zeigler averaged 9.2 ppg and 7.1 rpg, including a solid 12-point, 12-

rebound outing at Chattanooga, where the Paladins snapped a 21-game road losing skid to the Mocs with a 76-65 triumph. He later earned second team All-Southern Conference Tournament honors on the strength of a 14-point, seven-rebound outing in the Paladins' 62-57 championship game loss to Davidson.

✎ **CLEARING SOME HURDLES**...In addition to recording its first winning season since the 1992-93 season a year ago, Furman's 2001-02 campaign included the Paladins' first regular season sweep of south division tri-champion Chattanooga -- something no Paladin squad had accomplished since the 1979-80 season. Furman also swept arch-rival The Citadel, taking an 83-75 win in Greenville and a 70-64 overtime decision in Charleston, thereby handing the Bulldogs one of only two losses on their home court during the season. Another hurdle the Paladins cleared last year was the program's first win over perennial league power College of Charleston, whom the Paladins knocked off 44-43 in Southern Conference semifinal action in front of partisan Cougar crowd in North Charleston, S.C.

✎ **DON'T OVERLOOK THESE GUYS**...While Furman's veteran senior trifecta of **Guilherme Da Luz**, **Karim Souchu**, and **Kenny Zeigler** are sure to command their share of attention, three players set to play a pivotal role on this year's team include junior forward **Maleye Ndoye** (Dakar, Senegal) and a pair of sophomores, forward **Nick Sanders** (Leavenworth, Kansas) and center **Paco Gonzalez** (Miami, Fla.). Ndoye has registered as much improvement as any player in Furman's program over the past year and is sure to garner significant playing time in 2002-03. Last year he averaged 6.1 ppg and 4.0 rpg in 30 games and started in four contests. Included in his season was a 14-point, 10-rebound performance in a 68-67 win over Chattanooga in Greenville, which gave the Paladins their first regular season sweep of the Mocs since the 1980-81 campaign. He averaged 7.4 ppg and 4.9 rpg over the Paladins' final nine games, helping Furman to a 6-3 record in that span. Sanders returned early from a torn anterior cruciate ligament sustained late in his senior prep season to play a pivotal role in the Paladins' season a year ago. Although he only contributed 2.4 ppg and 3.4 rpg, Sanders' provided strong defense and infectious hustle in 13 starts at the power forward slot. And Paco Gonzalez appears poised to have a major impact in the post this year following a good freshman campaign that saw him post starts in 28 contests and average 5.5 ppg and 4.4 rpg. Furman's strongest player and more polished offensively than a year ago, he registered a season high 16 points in a regular season contest against eventual league champion and claimed 11 rebounds against Conference USA foe Saint Louis.

✎ **FRESHMAN IMPACT**...With nine lettermen returning to the fold this year, Furman appears to be in a position to avoid depending on freshmen for substantial playing time. Still, it appears a pair of first year players, redshirt freshman forward **Jason Patterson** (Lithonia, Ga.) and guard **Tony Carter** (Burlington, N.C.), will contribute some key minutes. Patterson, especially, appears set to gain playing time at the wing guard and small forward slots. In the Paladins' 97-59 win over the Southeast Atlanta All Stars on Nov. 7, he chipped in 11 points and a pair of rebounds in 17 minutes action. Carter, meanwhile, scored four points and collected a pair of rebounds, two assists, and three steals in eight minutes of playing time as a backup to point guard **Guilherme Da Luz**.

✎ **FURMAN SIGNS TWO**...Furman basketball signed two players in the early signing period: 6-1 guard **Eric Webb** from Grand Rapids, Minn., (Grand Rapids H.S.) and 6-3 swing man **Gerard Punch** from Phoenix, Az. (Brophy Prep).
